The Woodland Trust wants to help our community

The Welsh Government launched the My Tree, Our Forest scheme on 6 December 2021 with the Woodland Trust as the chosen delivery partner. The scheme aims to plant 300,000 trees by the end of March 2023 - offering every household in Wales the chance to plant a tree or have a tree planted on their behalf over the course of its lifetime. The scheme makes up one element of the ambitious National Forest of Wales which aims to plant 86 million trees across the country over the coming decades through a series of community—action and forest planting schemes. MONTHLY FLAG RAISING:

The Student Council at Bishopston Comprehensive School came up with the initiative of raising a themed flag each month to celebrate such themes as diversity, tolerance, mutual respect, our environment, climate change, etc. and I was delighted to sponsor the cost of the flags from my Community Fund. Big thanks to Jake Gates, Head Boy at the school, for raising this and seeking my support.

COMMUNITY COFFEE, CAKE AND CHAT MORNINGS:

Big thanks to Lucie Rees Sudbury, Lynne Ellis and Julie Eleanor Jones for doing the baking for the monthly Community Coffee Morning at the Community Centre in Murton. We have held three very successful mornings to date, opening the centre for coffee, cake, chat and convivial company. It is a great opportunity for people to get together in this way so I am delighted to be able to support this fantastic "Bishopston Together" initiative. Coffee mornings take pace from 10am-12pm on the last Saturday of each month. The next Community Coffee, Cake and Chat morning will take place 10am-1pm on Saturday 9th April at our Community Hall. There will also be some fantastic activities for children including an Easter Egg hunt and an Easter Bonnet parade organised in conjunction with the wonderful HSA from Bishopston Primary School.



PAVEMENT WIDENING BY THE CO-OP:

The road safety capital project to slow traffic down in the area around the Primary School on Bishopston Road and widen the narrow pavement below the Co-op has now been completed, amounting to an investment of around £30,000. Ever since I became your councillor, I have wanted to improve road safety around the Primary School but a lack of available funding was always an issue. However, the opportunity to put a bid together for a capital project arose so I met up with the Road Safety Team and was subsequently successful.

THE FORD IN CHURCH LANE WINS GOWER SOCIETY AWARD:

I hope you have had the opportunity to visit the restored ford in Church Lane, which is now complete. The ford is the last of its kind in Gower and was either in desperate need of restoration or be lost forever. Both Helen Nicholas and I faced challenges with this project but I could not be more thrilled to hear from the Gower Society that the restored Ford has won one of their 2021 Design Awards. These are given to worthy buildings and structures within the Lordship of Gower to recognise that the structure had been saved. Big thanks to Alan Jones, the stonemason, and his team for their fantastic workmanship and for the team from Highways at Swansea Council for helping to make this happen.

HEDGE LAYING: It was a bit (actually very) wet and windy when I joined Bob and Jules from Climate and Community on Murton Green. They had organised a training session for people to learn about hedge laying and as everyone can see, they are doing a fantastic job on the hedge that runs along Northway.

DAFFODILS:

Last year I ordered 2000 mixed daffodil bulbs to be planted throughout the Bishopston Ward and they looked fantastic, particularly at Murton Green. This year I ordered a further 2500 daffodil bulbs and I hope you agree, there is a fantastic display around the ward.

CYCLE TRACK WALKWAY ACROSS CLYNE COMMON TO MURTON:

I am pleased to say that the Cycle Track / Walkway across Clyne Common is a step closer! I have met regularly with Patrick Tribe, Barrie Cooper and the Active Travel Team at Swansea Council to discuss the plans for this route. I also held a meeting for residents in Murton and because of this engagement, several positive changes were made to the original design. We last met in late January when we heard that land acquisition was progressing well with discussions taking place with the final landowner. At that meeting we heard that a number of detailed ecological studies had already been carried out along the route and a new low-level rest area would be provided together with seating and information boards detailing some of the flora and fauna to be seen on the Common. The Council have submitted a bid for funding to Welsh Government to finance the building of the path in the next financial year. We hope that the path will be completed before April 2023 with further meetings taking place with the Active Travel Team before the end of March at the Community Centre.

NO. 14 BUS - UPDATE

Adventure Travel have replaced First Cymru and are now operating the No. 14 Bus. I met with the Managing Director to discuss the service so he knows what I expect! I am very grateful to everyone who has let me have initial feedback. Please be assured, I have passed all points on to the Company. I have also had confirmation that all drivers have now been issued with the cards to activate the 'bus blocker'. All buses should now be using the link road between the Hospital and the University and vice versa. I am working to get the No. 14 bus back to an hourly service, but at present the numbers of people using the service have taken a hit and are around 60% of pre-Covid usage.

It is, therefore, important to build up passenger numbers so we ask residents to provide with information:

- If you use the bus, what would make you use it more?
- If you don't use the bus at the moment, what would make you start using it?

Bishopston (Wellfield) Playpark:

It's great news that the first phase of our plans to develop the park and install new play equipment is complete and children are having a great time there. Watch this space for further updates on future developments. This follows on from my successful bid for funds from Swansea Council to buy play equipment for the park in Wellfield and is a great start to its upgrade. The new equipment includes a zip wire, swings with different seat choices to suit different ages, a slide, a seesaw, a multi-use springer and a uniplay unit including a slide. We were able to make these choices following consultation with pupils from the Primary School and a survey conducted by the Community Council, to find out what children and parents actually wanted to see in the park. There is, however, an issue of ponding, partly due to the heavy rain, so I have put in a bid for funds to improve the surface and drainage. Cllr. Susan Dunce, Cllr. Lucie Rees Sudbury and Cllr. Lynne Ellis from Bishopston Community Council and I have been working hard to deliver this for our community. I am also grateful to the team from Swansea Council for all their help in making this happen.

CHRISTMAS TREE LIGHTS

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who joined us for our fantastic Community event, which ended with the switching on of the Christmas Tree Lights at Murton Green. I am sure many new memories were made! It was great to have Father Christmas on his sleigh leading the lantern parade from the Primary School to Murton Green, the carol singing by the Primary School Choir and Murton Choir and of course, the complimentary refreshments and mince pies! Huge congratulations go to Alys Foster from Bishopston Primary School who, as the winner of the draw, then switched the lights on. Around 150 pupils held lanterns and they were joined by their families for the lantern parade, with hundreds turning up at Murton Green. What a turnout! Big thanks to everyone who helped make this happen, in particular the Bishopston HSA, Ros Brace, Zoe Syer, Cllr. Susan Dunce, Chair of the Bishopston Community Council and members, Sally-Anne Gates, Lynne Ellis, Lucie Rees Sudbury, Nick Williams, our Clerk Rhian Hill, Jo Griffiths and fellow teachers from the

Primary School and of course ,Father Christmas himself! I was certainly very pleased to play my part in delivering this for our
